## Seismic Design Provisions of the 2006 IBC

*Tuesday, May 15, 2007*

The 2006 International Building Code (IBC) relies almost entirely on ASCE 7-05 Minimum Design Loads for Buildings and Other Structures for its structural design provisions. This seminar presents the highlights of the seismic design provisions of ASCE 7-05, emphasizing differences from those of the 1997 Uniform Building Code (UBC). The most important differences are in two areas. First, the seismic input parameters of the IBC/ASCE 7 are spectral response accelerations, rather than the Z-factor of the UBC; zones do not even exist in the IBC. Second, The level of detailing that has to be done for a structure (ordinary, intermediate or special) depends on the Seismic Design Category (SDC) to which it is assigned, rather than the seismic zone in which it is located. The SDC is a function of the seismic hazard at the site, the occupancy of the structure, and the soil characteristics at the site of the structure. The soil-dependence of the SDC makes seismic design of the IBC very different from that of the UBC. These two broad aspects of seismic design will be discussed in detail.

Dr. S.K. Ghosh, President, S.K. He actively participates in the development of national design standards as a member of: ACI Committee 318, the ASCE Standards Committee on Minimum Design Loads for Buildings and Other Structures (ASCE 7), the Masonry Standards Joint Committee, and the Provisions Update Committee of the Building Seismic Safety Council. He is on the Board of Directors of the American Concrete Institute (ACI) and the Earthquake Engineering Research Institute (EERI).

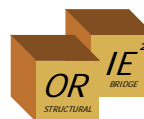

The program is managed by CA OES with cooperation from professional organizations. During a disaster, the volunteers are called into service and deployed for up to 7 days. They perform inspections (rapid or detailed) on damaged buildings and lifelines based on criteria set forth in ATC-20.

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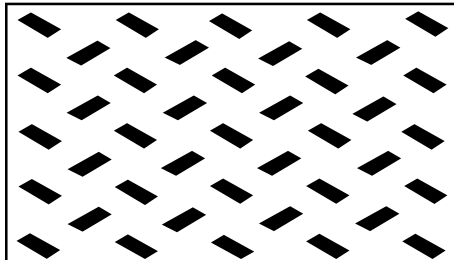
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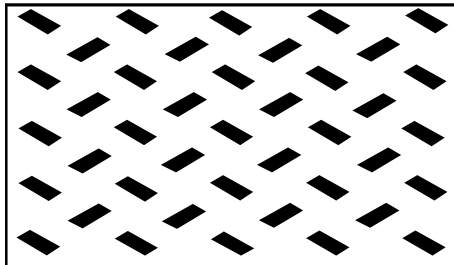
